Beach Bible Church has reserved one large group campsite for a week of fellowship at Dorst Creek Campground in Sequoia National Park. This year only one campsite was reserved so space is more limited than in previous years. Reservations can be made by payment in full.

In general, the basic idea behind the church camping experience is simple. The church is responsible for making the reservations for the group sites and campers are responsible for their own transportation, food, gear, activities, and park entrance fee.

This novel is about an ocean liner that goes down in the year 1914. It is about a lady named Grace and other castaways in the life boat.

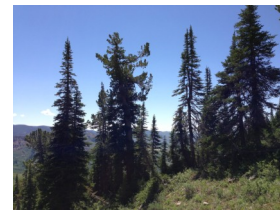

Proactive vs. Reactive Change

One of the things I learned in life is that change happens. No matter how much you may want things to stay the same, things will change. We get older, our kids grow up; seasons come and go. We can fight those changes (and we often do), but they will come one way or another.

I have wondered why we fight the inevitable. When it comes to health and aging, I completely understand. We want to enjoy our years rather than struggle through them. When it comes to our children, it is so hard to see those precious babies grow up into teens with attitudes. Our resistance to change is understandable, even if fighting the inevitable doesn't make sense.

However, there is another way of looking at it. I call it proactive change. Most often we react to change. We are doing that right now with the departure of the Johnson family. That wasn't change we expected or wanted, and now we are doing our best to fill the gap they left. Reactive change is hard.

However, going back to the health example; a proactive stance to change makes it easier. Knowing we are aging can mean changing our diet and exercise, to be prepared for the change. Knowing our kids are growing up means planning to make the most of our time with them in their childhood. I hope you see what I mean.

As a church, I pray that we are preparing for change; getting ahead of it; not waiting for crisis or urgent needs before stepping up. We need to think a few steps down the road and begin figuring out how to help now. We all want our children's and youth ministries to grow, but what are we proactively doing to be prepared for that. We are all wanting visitors to come to our church, but what are we proactively doing to be prepared for that.

If change is inevitable, let's at least be proactively prepared for it.
